In 1983 the music group U2 released an album called "War". The first track on the album is "Sunday, Bloody Sunday". It is a song about the violence in Northern Ireland that was raging at the time. For the Lord always acts to draw us up out of the pit again and again.

As we begin this new year, may we begin it with the new song written on our hearts and minds each day. And, may this song fill us with hope all year!
