HAPPY 100th BIRTHDAY, Girl Scouts!!!

On March 12, 1912, **Juliette "Daisy" Gordon Low** assembled 18 girls from Savannah, Georgia, for the first Girl Scout meeting. She believed that all girls should be given the opportunity to develop

physically, mentally, and spiritually. With the goal of bringing girls out of isolated home environments and into community service and the open air, Girl Scouts hiked, played basketball, went on camping trips, learned how to tell time by the stars, and studied first aid. Within a few years, Daisy's dream for a girl-centered organization was realized.

Today, Girl Scouts of the USA has a membership of over 3.4 million girls and adults -- a significant growth from its modest beginnings a century ago. In fact, more than 50 million women in the U.S. today are Girl Scout alumnae.

In 2012 Girl Scouts of the USA will mark 100 years of inspiring girls and young women with the ideals of courage, confidence and character. This milestone provides a unique opportunity to reflect on the tremendous contributions the organization has made over the past century, and to also rally support for the next hundred years of Girl Scouting. Exodus 20 tells the story of how God gave us the Ten Commandments. They tell us how God wants us to live. In your home devotional time this week, focus on the Ten Commandments, two at a time. Talk about what each one means, and pray for God's help to keep them. Try to memorize them.

Monday: I am the Lord your God: You shall have no other gods. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

Tuesday: Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy. Honor your father and your mother.

Wednesday: You shall not kill. You shall not commit adultery.

Thursday: You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Friday: You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife or his manservant or his maidservant or his cattle or anything that is your neighbor's.

SERVICE:

On Easter Sunday, we give gifts to each other (often Easter eggs) as a symbol of the gift of new life God gives to us through Jesus. Choose some people beyond your household to whom to give small Easter gifts this year. Purchase or make what you need, and prepare Easter cards or gift tags.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS:

The temple was a sacred place for God's Old Testament people. Talk together about what are sacred places or items for your household, through which you are reminded of God's presence. Design a sacred place especially for Lent: decorate an area in your home with a cross, candles and various items, symbols or pictures associated with Lent (you may wish to use lots of purple, the church color for Lent).
