Exodus 32:1-14

When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people gathered around Aaron, and said to him, "Come, make gods for us, who shall go before us; as for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him."²Aaron said to them, "Take off the gold rings that are on the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me." ³So all the people took off the gold rings from their ears, and brought them to Aaron. ⁴He took the gold from them, formed it in a mold, and cast an image of a calf; and they said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" ⁵When Aaron saw this, he built an altar before it; and Aaron made proclamation and said, "Tomorrow shall be a festival to the LORD." ⁶They rose early the next day, and offered burnt offerings and brought sacrifices of wellbeing; and the people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to revel. ⁷The LORD said to Moses, "Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; ⁸they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!'" ⁹The LORD said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. ¹⁰Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation."

¹¹But Moses implored the LORD his God, and said, "O LORD, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? ¹²Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth'? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. ¹³Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, 'I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it forever.''' ¹⁴And the LORD changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

Preparing for Next Week – October 14

Moses Intercedes for God's Unfaithful People

Key Verses: "Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people." Exodus 32:12b

Time: 1289 B.C.E.

Since Last Week: After the Israelites were freed from slavery in Egypt, Pharaoh changed his mind and sent his armies to retrieve the people. But God led the people with a pillar of fire by night and a pillar of cloud by day. Pharaoh's army trapped the people by the red sea, so Moses used his staff to part the waters and the people crossed safely. When Pharaoh's army tried to follow, they were swallowed up by the waters. After spending some time in the wilderness, the people began to complain that they had no food, so God provided quail and manna, which the people baked into cakes every day for their meals.

Background: Moses went up Mount Sinai, where God gave the people commandments and laws. Moses was gone for so long, the people lost faith that he would return. They created and worshiped a golden calf as their new god. God was angry and planned to destroy the people, but Moses interceded and changed God's mind.

Community: Why is it so easy for a group to transform from a peaceful crowd to a rebellious crowd so quickly? How can we lead groups of people to behave faithfully and peacefully?

At Home: What takes God's place as the most important things in your life? How can you rid yourself of false idols and follow only God?
