1 Samuel 1:9–11, 19–20; 2:1–10

⁹After they had eaten and drunk at Shiloh, Hannah rose and presented herself before the LORD. Now Eli the priest was sitting on the seat beside the doorpost of the temple of the LORD. ¹⁰She was deeply distressed and prayed to the LORD, and wept bitterly. ¹¹She made this vow: "O LORD of hosts, if only you will look on the misery of your servant, and remember me, and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a male child, then I will set him before you as a nazirite until the day of his death. He shall drink neither wine nor intoxicants, and no razor shall touch his head."

he lifts the needy from the ash heap, to make them sit with princes and inherit a seat of honor. For the pillars of the earth are the LORD's, and on them he has set the world." ⁹"He will guard the feet of his faithful ones, but the wicked shall be cut off in darkness; for not by might does one prevail." ¹⁰The LORD! Hannah Praises God for Samuel

1 Samuel 1:9-11, 19-20; 2:1-10

Key Verses: "In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, 'I have asked him of the Lord.'" 1 Samuel 1:20

Time: About 1050 B.C.E.

Since Last Week: The people of Israel wandered the desert for 40 years before God allowed Joshua to invade Canaan, the Promised Land. After the Israelites settled in Canaan, God appointed judges to keep the peace and to speak for God. God's judges included Deborah, Gideon, and Samson, whose stories can be found in the book of Judges. Nestled between the books of Judges and Samuel is Ruth, a story of two women who worked together to care for each other. Ruth was great-grandmother of David, and was an important part of Jesus' lineage.

Background: Hannah was a barren woman who lamented over not bearing a child. She prayed to God for a child, promising the child to God's service. God gave her Samuel, whom Hannah gave to be raised in the temple. At that time the people of Israel wanted to become a more unified state and powerful empire, ruled by a king like the surrounding kingdoms. This was a shift from the loosely connected 12 tribes that had been led by God and the judges. Samuel grew up to be one of God's prophets, and advisor to the newly appointed kings.

Community: What are the benefits and drawbacks for Israel to shift from a tribal nation to a kingdom? How might our political system serve God?

At Home: What have you asked God for that still awaits an answer? What did you bargain in return for a favorable answer? Does God require something in exchange for answered prayer? Where do you see God working while you wait for the answer?

Walking the streets of Keningau I can't help but hope that I don't stick out more than the average person. But, who am I kidding? I'm obviously a stranger to this place.

Sunday after church I sat in a restaurant with friends eating my fried noodles with my skilled chopstick maneuvers. I realized later that I hadn't even taken in the surroundings because I knew people were staring at me, and I just couldn't handle acknowledging it. I remember thinking, "So this is what it's like to be an outsider".

I've never been one to want unnecessary attention, but I have no choice in it here. Naturally my mind shifts to what to make of the situation, and then I remember a favorite quote of mine that always seems to be remembered at moments when I feel a little lost and small in this great big world.

"Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness, that most frightens us. We ask ourselves, who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talent, fabulous? Actually, who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small does not serve the world. There is nothing enlightening in shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We are all meant to shine as children do. We were born to make manifest the glory of God that is within us. It's not just in some of us; it's in everyone. And as we let our own lights shine, we unconsciously give others the permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others." Of course I am different, but so is each and every person. I look forward to conversations, relationships, and reflections that will help me to grow and be more confident in the person that I am and the person that I have been created to be. I hope that in due time I will not feel like I do not belong, but that I can identify my purpose and go confidently in the direction of that purpose, loving, enjoying, and embracing each person and situation as they are presented.

Why did youth from Cross of Calvary and area churches participate in **THE 30 HOUR FAMINE** last night?

The Problem

- Today, an estimated 7,000 children younger than 5 will die from causes related to hunger. Tomorrow, and the next day, this story will repeat itself. But it doesn't have to.
- There are 925 million hungry people around the world. It's hard to get our minds around a number that big, but it's about three times the population of the U.S.—or one in every seven people on the planet. And it's 925 million too many.
- Most of this hunger is happening in the developing world, but what if it hit closer to home? What would you do if hunger threatened the life of your best friend, or your brother, or your sister?

Why God wants us to care

- Physical needs matter to God. That's why Jesus' miracles include things like healing the sick, giving sight to the blind, and feeding 5,000 hungry people.
- Kids rate high in God's eyes. Jesus is pretty clear in Matthew 18:5—"Whoever welcomes a little child like this in my name welcomes me." Without money for food and other essentials, kids don't eat. Since that matters to God, it matters to us.
- Jesus wants us to be part of the solution. How do we know? When His disciples tell Him to send the
 hungry crowd away in Mark 6:37, He turns the tables on them by saying, "You give them something
 to eat" (emphasis added). When all they can do is splutter in surprise, He uses the sack lunch of a
 young boy to perform an amazing miracle—multiplying the loaves and fishes and giving them to the
 disciples to share until everyone in the crowd had had enough.

What our YOUTH are doing about it

 By doing the 30 Hour Famine, we're going to be part of a modern-day miracle—going without food to feed our own crowd. This isn't just another good cause. It's about walking in Jesus' footsteps and reaching out in compassion to feed and care for hungry children.
