THE READING Genesis 27:1-4, 15-23; 28:10-17

When Isaac was old and his eyes were dim so that he could not see, he called his elder son Esau and said to him, "My son"; and he answered, "Here I am." ²He said, "See, I am old; I do not know the day of my death. ³Now then, take your weapons, your quiver and your bow, and go out to the field, and hunt game for me. ⁴Then prepare for me savory food, such as I like, and bring it to me to eat, so that I may bless you before I die."

¹⁵Then Rebekah took the best garments of her elder son Esau, which were with her in the house, and put them on her younger son Jacob; ¹⁶and she put the skins of the kids on his hands and on the smooth part of his neck. ¹⁷Then she handed the savory food, and the bread that she had prepared, to her son Jacob.

¹⁸So he went in to his father, and said, "My father"; and he said, "Here I am; who are you, my son?" ¹⁹Jacob said to his father, "I am Esau your firstborn. I have done as you told me; now sit up and eat of my game, so that you may bless me." ²⁰But Isaac said to his son, "How is it that you have found it so quickly, my son?" He answered, "Because the LORD your God granted me success." ²¹Then Isaac said to Jacob, "Come near, that I may feel you, my son, to know whether you are really my son Esau or not." ²²So Jacob went up to his father Isaac, who felt him and said, "The voice is Jacob's voice, but the hands are the hands of Esau." ²³He did not recognize him, because his hands were hairy like his brother Esau's hands; so he blessed him.

¹⁰Jacob left Beer-sheba and went toward Haran. ¹¹He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. ¹²And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. ¹³And the LORD stood beside him and said, "I am the LORD, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give

to you and to your offspring; ¹⁴ and your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and all the families of the earth shall be blessed in you and in your offspring. ¹⁵ Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." ¹⁶ Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, "Surely the LORD is in this place — and I did not know it!" ¹⁷ And he was afraid, and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven."

LED Questions –



Does the LED fold back to the wall? For services that do not require the use of the LED, it will fold flush to the wall.

Background: Jacob and his older twin, Esau, were rivals since before their birth. Their father, Isaac, loved Esau, but their mother, Rebekah, loved Jacob. When time came for Isaac to bestow his deathbed blessing upon Esau, Rebekah helped Jacob trick him out of the blessing. Jacob covered himself with animal skins so that his arms would feel like hairy Esau's. When Jacob fled Esau's fury, God told him in a dream that God would fulfill the blessing. Despite Jacob's trickery, God remained faithful.

Community: How are the blessings bestowed in your community distributed? What might your community of faith do to ensure that all needs are met? Get involved in one of your faith community's missional or outreach opportunities and contribute to the diminishing of your community's inequities.

At Home: How have you tried to force God's hand? What might you do to let go of control over some aspect of your life that is begging for God's control?

CARING CONVERSATIONS

God's unwavering faithfulness to Abraham and Sarah and their descendents says more about God than it does about them. In fact, one might even wonder why God remained faithful to someone like Jacob! Recall the story in Genesis 27:1-4, 15-33; 28:10-17 and consider the following questions: What were some of the consequences Jacob faced as a result of his choices? When have you made and broken a promise? When has someone made a promise to you and broken it? What were the consequences? Why do you think God continues to love and bless God's people, even in such circumstances?

DEVOTIONS

Try shaping a time of devotion around the following basic pattern:

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of Christ in your midst. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and questions in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What questions do you have about this reading? What do you want to remember from this reading?
- · Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

SERVICE

A pivotal moment in the story of Jacob is when he is reconciled with Esau after many years (Genesis 33:1-11). Consider: In what ways might offering forgiveness or pursuing reconciliation be considered acts of service? Think of one person with whom you are "on the outs." What would it take to repair that relationship? What might you do to begin the journey to reconciliation? Pray for God's help and guidance.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

When Jacob awakens from his dream, he sets up the rock that had been his pillow as an altar to help him remember what he had experienced and heard there. Consider placing a rock in the place where you gather for devotion and prayer, perhaps a rock from a favorite outdoor location. It could be large and imposing or small and portable, something to take with you when you are staying in a motel or camping.


Christian Community Outreach Center After School Program
