## October 20, 2013 1 Samuel 16:1-13; Psalm 51:10-14

**Key Verse:** "But the Lord said to Samuel, 'Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for the Lord does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." I Samuel 16:7

Call of David

Time: about 1000 BCE

**Background:** After years of following God with the guidance of judges and prophets, the people became eager to be ruled by a king. God warned them that they did not need a king if they were following God. But the people insisted.

The prophet, Samuel, was appointed by God to anoint a king over Israel. After a failed attempt at choosing Saul to be king, Samuel followed God's command to find a king among the sons of Jesse. Samuel inspected all of Jesse's sons except David, the youngest and smallest. Although they were leaders by outward appearance, God was searching for a leader with a pure heart. God chose David to be the next king.

**Community:** What criteria does your community use to select its leaders? What qualities does it seek? What qualities would God choose? How do they differ? How are they similar?

**At Home:** Where do you seek guidance? Who or what do you follow? Make a shift this week to follow the ways of the world less, and God's ways more. Do one thing to open yourself so that God can create in you a clean heart.

#### PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

God Who Sees into Our Hearts, our society tries to stick all kinds of labels on us, often based on the way we look. Sometimes we are even tempted to believe what the world tells us about ourselves. But you remind us that you see far deeper than mere outward appearance. Remind us always that the only label that matters is "Child of God." Amen. (1 Samuel 16)

#### A BLESSING TO SHARE

Use these words to bless another person:

Child of God, you are beloved by God and by me. Remember that because of your baptism, God looks at your heart and sees only Jesus. In the name of the Father, + and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

## **DAILY BIBLE READINGS**

These readings are provided to help you reflect on today's reading (Monday – Wednesday) and look forward to next Sunday's reading (Thursday – Saturday). Try to take time each day to read the assigned verses: What connections do you notice? What words or images stand out? What seems important to remember?

If your household includes younger children, try using a child-friendly Bible like Spark! Picture Bible (Augsburg Fortress) or The Jesus Storybook Bible (Zondervan; available from the Vibrant Faith Ministries online store, www.vibrantfaith.org).

#### CARING CONVERSATIONS

When God led Samuel to choose David as the next king of Israel, Samuel noticed the strong, handsome appearance of David's older brothers and assumed one of them was God's chosen. In our day, television commercials try to get us to believe this general message: "There's something wrong with you unless you use our product." Make a game of identifying and talking about the advertising messages you see or hear—you might call it "What's Wrong with Me?" God reminds us that we are much, MUCH more than the way we think we look or other people think we look.

#### DEVOTIONS

Try shaping a time of devotion around the following basic pattern:

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of Christ in your midst. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and questions in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What do you want to remember from this reading?
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

It can be a challenge to get everyone together for devotion and prayer. Try different times, perhaps in the morning or before bedtime. If you are living alone, how might you use electronic media to share this time with others?

## SERVICE

"Caring Conversations" invites you to consider issues of outward appearance and self-worth. Many people struggle with these same issues. To whom might you offer this reminder: "God sees your value, and so do I!"? How can you serve other people by reminding them of their value as God's child?

## RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

David's value and worth to God was made visible by Samuel's blessing and anointing (1 Samuel 16:13). This highlights the importance of a ritual of blessing your loved ones. How can your household adopt a ritual of blessing one another as part of your regular practice? (See "A Blessing to Share" on the front of this insert for a blessing to try.)
