### A Blessing to Confirmation Families and Volunteers.

Confirmation at Cross of Calvary is scheduled at 6:30pm, and we offer a light meal for the kids and the adult volunteers. You may ask why...

- Class is earlier, so the youth and volunteers can be on their way home to their families by 7:30. Youth have time for homework and to touch base at home. Volunteers and staff with small children are home to tuck them in.
- The meal offers a relaxed an open time for relationship building among the youth, the staff and the volunteers. This time of sharing and listening is valued by all.
- Biblically, table fellowship is vital to the strength of the community!
- When volunteers (not just Confirmation parents) sign up to serve a meal, the stress level on the staff is reduced, so they are not scrambling to prepare a meal in the afternoon. Serving is a gift to the church as well, as we are not buying supplies or ordering pizza.

Because God calls on volunteers to serve, our Confirmation program is a relaxed, enjoyable time for all. Is God calling you? Consider asking a friend to help serve with you. ### December 1, 2013 Daniel 3:1, 8-30

Key Verse: "Nebuchadnezzar said, 'Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, who has sent his angel and delivered his servants who trusted in him." Daniel 2:28

Time: mid 500's BCE

**Background:** The book of Daniel was written at a time when God's people were in exile. They had



been conquered and were being ruled by a succession of kings. These kings held terrible power and regularly behaved with evil intent.

Many of God's people remained faithful, even in the face of danger. Three such followers were Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. They continued to worship God, even when the penalty was death.

King Nebuchadnezzar tried to have them burned in a furnace for failing to worship his gods. The three remained faithful, and God saved them from death. Their faithfulness, and God's dramatic rescue, turned the mind of the king. He decreed that all people should respect their God, and he promoted the three to positions of power.

**Community:** What lies or false idols has culture perpetuated that influence the way your community behaves? How might God's truth be told so as to influence your community differently?

At Home: To what cultural pressures have you bowed? Do one thing this week to resist the pressures of the world, and turn your attention toward God.

## DAILY BIBLE READINGS

Advent is a season in which we hear vivid pictures of hope in the appointed Bible readings. These words remind us of what we are waiting for—not just Christmas with all its shiny trappings, but our Savior who is Christ the Lord. Each reading this week contains a picture from the Old Testament of what the Savior is like. Try to pick out this picture as you read.

## CARING CONVERSATIONS

The stories of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego in the fiery furnace (Daniel 3:1, 8-30) and Daniel in the lions' den (Daniel 6:1-27) are stories about God holding on to God's people in times of danger, fear, and hopelessness. How would you complete the following sentences?

## DEVOTIONS

Shape your devotions around the following basic pattern for the season of Advent:

- Gathering Prayer. Light one candle on your Advent wreath to help you focus on the presence of Christ in your midst. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and discussion starters in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. As you read the passage listed, look for a picture of what Jesus is like.
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

Try to find a time when everyone in the household can be together, perhaps in the morning or before bedtime. How might you share this time with others if you are alone?

## SERVICE

Instead of spending a lot of money on Christmas gifts, a growing practice among some Christians is to give a monetary donation in the name of loved ones to a local charity or global aid organization like Heifer International. Talk over this idea with your household. If you decide to do this, discuss what you might do at the time you normally would open gifts.

## **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**

Darken the room. Light one candle on your Advent wreath. Notice how the light radiates into your space. Take a few silent moments to reflect on how God's love radiates around you. As you light an additional candle each week, notice how the light grows as Christmas draws near.

This is also a season of music. Each night, listen to some music—or sing or play some—that gives you hope, joy, and peace.
