No one was able to answer your call? Every effort is

Feb 1 - Mid-Winter Get-Away at RenVilla

John 2:13-25

Key Verses: "He told those who were selling the doves, 'Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!' His disciples remembered that it was written, 'Zeal for your house will consume me.'" John 2:16-17

Time: 30-33 CE

Background: In the Gospel of John, the cleansing of the temple was Jesus' first act once his ministry began. (In the other three gospels, it happened just before his crucifixion.) In John's gospel, Jesus used signs to point toward God, always redirecting people's attention away from himself, and toward God in heaven.

When Jesus overturned the tables, the Jews asked him for a sign to show that he had authority to do what he had done. They didn't realize that Jesus was already beginning to perform signs that God had sent Jesus to reveal God to the people.

Community: What questionable behaviors or customs does your community practice that are so embedded in your community, they have not been examined for a long time? What would need to happen to begin to make changes to those customs?

At Home: What signs have you sought or seen to indicate that God is present in your life? Where will you look for God this week?

DAILY BIBLE READINGS

As the church continues in the season of Epiphany, the Bible readings continue to help us answer the question, "Who is Jesus?" Following the theme of the story of Jesus clearing the temple, the daily readings this week are about worship. A good question to ask of each reading is: *What does this reading show me or tell me about Jesus?* Ask this of all readings, including those from the Old Testament.

Whatever your age, reading the daily passage from a children's Bible may open new ways of understanding. Consider one like the *Spark! Picture Bible* (Augsburg Fortress) or *The Jesus Storybook Bible* (Zondervan; available from the Vibrant Faith Ministries online store, www.vibrantfaith.org).

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Jesus' outrageous action in the temple reminds us that nothing is more important than worship of God. It wasn't so much the presence of the animal sellers that was the problem—animals were sold for the convenience of people who traveled some distance to Jerusalem, so that they could bring a fitting sacrifice to worship. The issue was the dishonesty and profiteering surrounding this enterprise.

In Matthew 6:21, Jesus says, "Your heart will always be where your treasure is." Martin Luther is credited with saying it this way: "Whatever you make most important in your life, there is your god." Discuss what you tend to make most important in your life. *What does it mean to treasure God above all else*?

DEVOTIONS

Try to find a time when everyone in your household can gather for devotions, perhaps in the morning or before bedtime. If you are alone, how might you include other people in your devotions?

Shape your devotions—and devotions are a form of worship—around the following basic pattern:

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of Christ in your midst. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and questions in "Caring Conversations."
- **Daily Bible Reading.** Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What questions do you have about this reading? What do you want to remember from this reading?
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

SERVICE

In what ways do you participate in worship at your church? Perhaps this is a good time to see how you might be able to serve in worship or help to prepare for worship. How could you invite others to join in worship with you?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

"Devotions" (above) suggests a pattern for daily worship. Don't become discouraged when daily distractions disrupt this ritual. Keep working on making it a tradition in your life. Start new every day, rejoicing that our God is the God of grace!
