PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Lord Jesus, the apostle Paul challenges us to be like you—being humble and not doing anything out of selfish purposes. But I know myself, and I can't do these things without your presence. Send your Holy Spirit into my heart and life every day, so I might be more like you. Amen.

A BLESSING TO SHARE

Mark another person's forehead with the sign of the cross as you say this Easter blessing: Jesus is the resurrection and the life, and that life has been promised to you. Amen.

DAILY BIBLE READINGS

Paul's list of what it means to "think the same way that Christ Jesus thought" (Philippians 2:5, CEV) reveals that he knew well the stories and teachings of Jesus. As you read this week's Bible readings, take time to ponder this: *What is Jesus doing in this passage and how might I follow this example in my own life?*

If your household includes younger children, you might want to use a childfriendly Bible like the *Spark! Picture Bible* (Augsburg Fortress) or *The Jesus Storybook Bible* (Zondervan; available from the Vibrant Faith Ministries online store, www.vibrantfaith.org).

In this week's reading from Philippians 2, Paul lists characteristics of Jesus and challenges his readers to live in a similar way. Recall times you felt you were able to respond to a situation in an unselfish way. Discuss: When you read Paul's list in Philippians 2:1-13, which way of being or acting is the biggest challenge for you? How might someone else help you stay accountable to living in ways that reflect Jesus' ways?

DEVOTIONS

VIBRAN FAITH

Continue your Easter worship by gathering everyone in your household for devotions. The following basic pattern can be your guide:

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of the risen Christ. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and questions in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What do you want to remember from this reading?
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

Try having devotions at different times, perhaps after school or while you eat dinner. In what ways can you connect with other people for devotions if you live alone?

SERVICE

Any time we are invited to serve God by serving others, we are being invited to live out Paul's "Jesus List" from Philippians 2:1-13. As you read the Daily Bible Readings for this week, jot down ideas of ways you might serve God by serving other people. Choose one idea to carry out this week. What will you need to do make this happen?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

One of the oldest Easter traditions is for Christians to exchange this greeting by alternating lines: *Jesus Christ is risen today! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!* During this final week of the Easter season, exchange this greeting at the beginning of your devotions.

Philippians 2:1-13

Key Verses: "Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." Philippians 2:9-11

Time: 54-61 CE

Background: This Philippians text includes what might be the oldest Christian hymn in existence. The hymn lifted up what it meant to be in the same mind with Christ. These qualities included surrender, humility, and obedience. Because of these things, God exalted Jesus so that all things in heaven and on earth would praise and honor him. By emulating Christ we too, can honor God and be honored by God.

Paul encouraged the Philippians to live into the kind of life described in the hymn so that God would be honored through their work and their lives.

Community: What are the top values our culture esteems for success? How do they work for or against surrender, humility, and obedience? How do culture's top values fit into Jesus' plan for our lives?

At Home: What hymn or Bible verse best describes your faith life? Has it been so for a while? Is it time for a change, or does this still ring true for you?
