A BLESSING TO SHARE

Mark another person's forehead with the sign of the cross and blow gently on the top of his or her head before you give this Pentecost blessing: Blow, Spirit, blow, and fill <u>(name)</u> with God's love and purpose. Amen.

DAILY BIBLE READINGS

Today is the Day of Pentecost, the beginning of a new church season. This day is sometimes called "the birthday of the church" because after the Day of Pentecost, the followers of Jesus who were gathered together that day moved out from Jerusalem to proclaim the gospel message of God's love and to minister to people in need in Jesus' name. The events of the story recorded in Acts 2 are marked by a miraculous wind. As you read the Daily Bible Readings this week, note that Pentecost was not the first time God blew the breath of life into God's people! Identify what God's breath accomplished in each passage.

Whatever your age, you may enjoy reading the stories in these daily readings from a children's Bible or Bible storybook.

CARING CONVERSATIONS

The stories in the Daily Bible Readings tell of God's life-giving wind, spirit, or breath. Have you ever had a medical condition or illness that made it hard to breathe? If so, tell how this illness affected (or still affects) your daily activities. Discuss: Why is the image of breath or wind a helpful way to think about God's life-giving power in human lives?

DEVOTIONS

Celebrate Pentecost by gathering everyone in your household for devotions. The following basic pattern can be your guide:

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of God's fiery Spirit. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and question in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What do you want to remember from this reading?
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share." During the summer months, you may find that gathering outdoors for devotions is meaningful. Where in your yard or neighborhood might you enjoy a quiet moment with God and with one another? If you are alone, whom might you invite to share these outdoor devotions with you?

SERVICE

The readings this week speak of life-giving breath. What organizations in your area promote clean air and healthy lungs? Learn about their work and consider how you might support it. Or do an act of kindness for someone you know who has breathing difficulties.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Rituals and traditions are not necessarily serious or somber. This week's blessing (on the front) includes a playful suggestion to blow gently on the top of one another's heads as a reminder and sign of God's life-giving Spirit. How might a shared memory of this ritual playfulness be part of telling the story of how God's presence has been made known in your life?

Acts 2:1-21

Key Verses: "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." Acts 2:1-4

Time: 30 CE

Background: Pentecost means "fifty." Originally, Jews would have gathered fifty days after Passover to celebrate the wheat harvest. Today, Christians celebrate Pentecost fifty days after Easter to celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit to the early believers.

The variety of languages to which the Holy Spirit revealed itself, and Peter's quoting of the prophecy, in which men and women, young and old, slaves and free, all received the word, indicated how widespread the message was about to become.

Community: How do messages become widespread in today's world? How can you use social media to spread the good news of Jesus to others?

At Home: What does the Holy Spirit want to say to you and through you? What can you do this week to open yourself to the Holy Spirit's word?
