DAILY BIBLE READINGS

Jesus' resurrection from the dead seems almost too good to be true, but God has been preparing for this through the entire story of God's people in Scripture. Pause after you read each Bible passage and think about this: How is this story like Jesus being raised from the dead?

If your household includes younger children, you might want to use a child-friendly Bible like the *Spark! Picture Bible* (Augsburg Fortress) or *The Jesus Storybook Bible* (Zondervan; available from the Vibrant Faith Ministries online store, www.vibrantfaith.org).

CARING CONVERSATIONS

When we celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter, we celebrate new life. This new life is promised to us in the resurrection of the dead. God gives us this new life today—in Baptism, we have been "made new" to live each day as God's children. Each day we die to sin and are raised to new life in God's kingdom. Think about your own experiences of new life. For example, perhaps you experienced the joy of new life when you were forgiven by someone. Tell one another about times when you felt as though you had been raised from the dead.

DEVOTIONS

Continue your Easter worship by gathering everyone in your household for devotions. The following basic pattern can be your guide:

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of the risen Christ. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What do you want to remember from this reading?
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

Try having devotions at different times, perhaps after supper or right before bedtime. If you are alone, how might you include other people in your time of devotions?

SERVICE

As you celebrate Easter, look around your community for something in need of "new life." Is there a city hiking trail that could use some care or an elderly person's home that could use a fresh coat of paint? In some places at this time of year, the winter's garbage that was plowed into the snow banks needs to be picked up. Choose a project to give your community a touch of new life.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

One of the oldest Easter traditions is for Christians to exchange this greeting by alternating lines: Jesus Christ is risen today! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Create your own tradition by greeting worshipers in church with this greeting.
