What is CIRCLE? Circle stands for: (Creative Integration of Resources for a Cohesive Life for Everyone) Resources include: money, time, talents,

networks, community resources and supports

Our belief is that *everyone* has resources to offer and everyone has needs.

Circle's is the same as MentorWorks Too-Kinship's mission which is to establish quality relationships for the purpose of friendship, support, stability and community. You can get stuff anywhere but not with a positive caring relationship. **Our vision** is the recycling and sharing of resources for stronger communities through building community, dignity, self respect and relationships.

We value the creation of caring communities by welcoming all, valuing all, supporting all and learning from all.

We try to efficiently redistribute goods and services from individuals, businesses, and churches to individuals and families in need and to communicate availability of resources to community members in need to avoid and minimize the impacts felt by individuals and families in crisis. The faster a family gets on their feet the stronger and healthier our communities are.

**CIRCLE Boutique (Thrift Store)-** is a means to raise funds to support the other projects. The store is run with volunteer staff. **CIRCLE Clothing Pantry (Free household and clothing pantry)-** is available free to families and individuals in need of household furniture, utensils, appliances, and clothing. The pantry moves people out of the crisis situation into a thriving

situation faster. The pantry also is a segue for the mentor program and other support programs. **Summer Camps**- CIRCLE applies on the behalf of disadvan-

summer Camps- CIRCLE applies on the behalf of disadvantaged children to summer camp opportunities in Minnesota. CIRCLE coordinates funding and transportation through other agencies and grants.

**Salvation Army Vouchers-** CIRCLE is a Renville County client support agency trained by the Salvation Army to provide emergency aid to families and individuals.

**"Getting Ahead in a Just getting by world" Groups** – CIR-CLE is offering this curriculum developed by AHA Process to assist individuals and families eligible for government assistance to move out of poverty.

**MentorWorks Too-Kinship** is an adult to youth- one on one mentoring program that serves children in Renville County. This has been in existence for over 12 years under the fiscal responsibility of the RCW School District. The program may expand to include other mentoring relationships such as financial mentoring, teen mother mentoring, mentoring for mentally ill adults.

Back to School Supplies-CIRCLE collects school supplies from individuals, churches and organizations and distributes to Renville County students whose families would not have the financial ability to purchase necessary school supplies. Quilts- CIRCLE distributes quilts made and provided by area church women's groups to families in need.

Winter Outerwear Distribution -Good used winter outerwear such as snow boots, snow pants, jackets, hats and gloves are collected and distributed to children and adults in need.

Santa's Closet – This Renville County Christmas gift program is coordinated by CIRCLE. Volunteers collect money, toys and other gift items to distribute to disadvantaged families at Christmas time.

Comfort bags for foster kids-CIRCLE coordinates the preparing and distribution of duffle bags with toothbrush, toothpaste, fleece blanket and stuffed animal for children entering the foster care system.

And the Spirit **immediately** drove him out into the wilderness. (Mark 1:12) Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea--for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, "follow me and I will make you fish for people." And **immediately** they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brohter John, who were in their boat mending the nets. **Immediately** he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him. (Mark 1:16-20)

Immediately. Three times it appears in the first chapter of Mark. It sets the tone for the whole chapter and the whole Gospel of Mark. In the Gospel that really doesn't have a birth narrative of Jesus at all, we start at some vague sense of a beginning (beginning of time, the new beginning that is talked about in Isaiah, the coming of Jesus on earth?) And, then we are launched into the baptism and ministry of Christ. There is a sense of urgency that is hard to miss in this gospel. It is right now. It is not something to think about and get back to later. It is not some project for spare time. It is not something that will happen at some future date. Nor is it something that we can do when we get a round to it.

In high school we read Zig Zigler's book <u>See You at the Top!</u> He manufactured wooden circular chips that simply said "Tuit." The punch line was that he had heard people say that they would do such and such when they "got a round tuit." So, he would pass out these "Round Tuits" and would say now you have no more excuses. You have a "Round Tuit." Now you have to get done what you have always set aside.

In the gospel of Mark, we are given a "Round Tuit". The time for us as the readers of this Gospel is to plunge in right now. The Good News of Jesus Christ is for right now. Immediately. The Good News is not about some future that is waiting for us. It is about right now. Immediately.

There is grace abounding in this...immediately. There is no time for preparation or getting your ducks in a row. You are ready right now. It takes away any sense that we have to earn our status as Christians. Because we are given the call--right now, immediately.

As we venture into our Lenten season, may we hear Christ's call to us, and may we experience the immediacy of his grace, of his Gospel, of our lives in him.

A blessed month of February to all of you!
