Preparing for Next Week - September 16God Promises Abraham DescendantsGenesis 15:1-6

Key Verse: "[God] brought [Abraham] outside and said, 'Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.'" Genesis 15:5

Time: About 1850 B.C.E.

Since Last Week: After Adam and Eve were banished from the Garden of Eden, their son, Cain, killed their other son, Abel. God was disgusted by humankind and resolved to destroy the earth by flood. God saved Noah and his family because Noah was a righteous man. God made a covenant with Noah never to destroy the world by flood again.

Once humanity was restored, people once again tried to become like God, building a tower at Babel to reach the heavens. God tangled their tongues (mixed their languages) and scattered the people.

Background: Once again, God found a righteous man, Abram. God promised Abram land (which for a wanderer, meant life and stability). When Abram's people and his nephew, Lot's people began arguing over space, they parted ways. As Abram settled into the new land, God promised him and his wife, Sarai descendants as numerous as the stars.

Community: How does knowing that all the people of the world are God's beloved children shape how you act in the world?

At Home: What has God promised you? How might you live and behave this week knowing that those promises are upheld?

Genesis 2:4b-7, 15-17; 3:1-8

^{4b} In the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens, ⁵when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up — for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; ⁶but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground — ⁷then the LORD God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being. ¹⁵The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. ¹⁶And the LORD God commanded the man, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; ¹⁷but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die."

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" ²The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; ³but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die." ⁴But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die; ⁵for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." ⁶So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. ⁷Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

⁸They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his

wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. Luke 11:1-4

He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." 2He said to them, "When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

3Give us each day our daily bread.

4And forgive us our sins,

for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us.

And do not bring us to the time of trial."
