Flowers placed on the Altar are in loving memory Jack Wagemaker. **Key Verses:** "[The Lord of hosts said:] I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth." 2 Samuel 7:9 **Time:** About 1000 B.C.E.

Since Last Week: Samuel grew up in the house of the priest, Eli, and became a prophet for God. The Ark of the Covenant, which housed the tablets containing God's Ten Commandments, and which represented for the Israelites the presence and favor of God, was lost and recovered. When the people demanded of God a king, Samuel first anointed Saul. But Saul displeased the Lord, so Samuel anointed David, who would be regarded as Israel's greatest king. David brought the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem, which had been made Israel's capital city.

Background: After bringing the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem, David desired to build a temple as a permanent home for God. But God didn't want David to build God a home. Instead, God promised David that God would make a great kingdom of David's descendants.

Community: What are the benefits and drawbacks of having a permanent place of worship? How might your church building serve God?

At Home: Have you ever desired to do something for God, just to have God turn around and do something for you? In what ways can God's blessings for you become blessings for others?

30 Hour Famine

38 youth and 9 adults went without basic needs to give to those in need

- They went 30 hours eating only 3 popsicles to raise awareness about hunger.
- They slept outside in 38 degree weather to raise awareness about poverty
- Our youth raised over **\$2,300** among 5 area churches.
- They packaged Kids against Hunger bags.

They packaged 43 boxes, which is equivalent to 10,000 meals That can feed 43 people for 7 months. Or 309 for one month.

After 24 hours they realized how hard it is to focus, and how little energy one has. It has changed their lives, and they way they view others. **They made a difference, can you?**
