## Council Minutes - JUNE

June 19, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 pm by Council President Brian Boen.

Chelsey was designated as the recorder for the meeting.

Devotions were led by Brian.

The minutes of the May meeting were reviewed. Laurie to amend 'a congregation' to 'the congregation.'

A motion to approve the minutes was made by Gordy, seconded by Michelle, motion carried.

Financial Secretary / Treasurer Report – Doing well.

A motion to approve the Fin. Sec. / Treasurer Report was made by Marie seconded by Cindy, motion carried.

Pastor's Report- Pastor attended Synod Assembly and came back with new thoughts for the upcoming year. One was from Rich Melheim regarding Confirmation and Faith Five. Faith Five is a devotional program for all ages. Pastor is planning on using a portion of this as curriculum for Confirmation and another portion for students to do with their families. Faith Five can be integrated easily into the Vibrant Faith Frame that Cross of Calvary is using now. Pastor will offer a 6-week training to a 'focus group.'

Pastor would like to form a committee to look at ways in which to further reach members of the congregation and community.

Minister of Faith Formation's Report— Chelsey reported that the Youth Relay for Life team has grown, and they are beginning fundraising. Next week, Cross of Calvary will host the FUEL Summer Bash which will include campfire worship, snacks, and night games for Jr and Sr High students.

VBS planning is underway. It will be combined with Our Saviors Lutheran and held in Bird Island, August 4-8<sup>th</sup>. The layout is very similar to what Cross of Calvary has done in the past. With extra hands from each congregation, she sees this year being a success.

Worship & Music- Musicians have been receiving the 'Saturday' pay for 'Sunday' service on Thursdays. It was decided that the musicians are to receive the same rate for the same amount of work.

A motion was made by Gordy to change the number for a quorum from 40 to 60, seconded by Michelle, motion carried.

Technology- The committee did not meet, but Laurie sent an update. The mount for the LED is being made by the Olivia Machine Shop. The LED Panel will be ordered and delivered in July. Installation of the new system is to take place in August.

**Property-** Dave has requested

three quotes for installation of soffit and fascia. The landscaping around the Chestnut St. sign has begun.

The minutes of the June meeting were reviewed. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Eric, seconded by Todd, motion carried.

Financial Secretary / Treasurer Report for June and July -

Summer offerings have been low. The overall balance is okay.

The remodeling project began with approximately \$175,000. There is \$8,400 left. Two items remain on the wish list - seal coating the parking lot and updating the lighting in the Fellowship Hall. A bid for seal coating will be addressed next year when the city does coating around town. An option to consider is to resurface. Fellowship Hall lighting will be looked into.

The balcony lighting needs to be increased. Spot lights will be added this fall.

Several members of the congregation are attending a Stewardship seminar next week.

A motion to approve the Fin. Sec. / Treasurer Report was made by Eric, seconded by Gordy, motion carried.

Pastor's Report- Pastor touched on a number of new things coming up this fall, including the Confirmation curriculum and *Faith Five* practices from Faith Incubators. He has spent a great deal of time planning for everything for fall.

Minister of Faith Formation's Report- Relay for Life was an amazing opportunity for the youth. Their energy was great, and they tripled their goal. VBS was a successful venture with Our Saviors. Chelsey wants to have a meeting with those who helped to evaluate. The Thirty-Hour Famine will take place again this fall. WOW curriculum is from Spark. She is looking forward to new beginnings, as many things feel a little different. Rally is Sept. 8.

**Youth Ministry** - Fund raising was discussed. Camps went well.

The following committees did not meet—Worship & Music – Parish Life – World Missions – Parish Education - Evangelism

**Property-** Shared information about flooring. The church received money from the roof manufacturer to repair some water damage to the organ and the speaker. The LED is to be mounted at the end of Aug.

**Stewardship/Finance** – Shared in the financial report.

**Technology-** Provided the swing arm is completed, the LED should be in use by Rally Sunday.

#### —OLD BUSINESS

C of C's offering at the Synod Assembly was shared equally between Luther Seminary, the HIV/AIDS Coordinator in our companion synod, and our three Bible camps.

Council discussed realignment of committees. Pastor will share the information during a Temple Talk on Rally Sunday. Committees will meet at 7pm on the same Wednesday evening as the Council meeting.
