Pastor's Corner

Last month we talked about the first step in Melheim's Faith 5. The first one is a simple step-share. We are to share our highs and lows or best part of the day and worst part of the day. Whatever gets you talking about more than a simple "alright" or "it was good". We get to the heart at what made it good or made it bad or made it simply alright. It may be harder at first to share, because we aren't very used to digging in and talking about what we have experienced.

Oh, we talk about a lot of stuff, but in many ways we are trained not to talk about ourselves. Now this is good, up to a point. Nobody wants to be around someone who will only talk about themselves. But, oftentimes we do not talk about ourselves to a fault. We keep things on the surface, not only about ourselves, but we are also telling the other "don't open up too much, because I'm not". Once we start sharing on a regular basis (note sharing-both talking about themselves and listening about the other) there are noticeable benefits that are far too deep and great to go into here, but if you would like to know more, I would highly recommend

getting a copy of Rich Melheim's book "Holding your Family Together".

So after we have shared, where could we go? Now, just to be clear, if all you did was the share part, you would be miles, ahead of most people. But, if you want to go even deeper, Melheim suggests that you read. You would read a bible story or verse. That's it. Simply read that Bible story or verse and let it sit with you. You may be surprised to find connections between what you have just shared with another person and what you read from Scripture. But more on that next month. For now read a story or a verse from the Bible. If you have small children, or even if you don't have small children you may prefer a Bible story book in simple straight forward language and story telling form. Simply read the story and talk about that story. Next month we will talk about how to put ourselves into the Bible.
