### A Blessing to Confirmation Families and Volunteers.

Confirmation at Cross of Calvary is scheduled at 6:30pm, and we offer a light meal for the kids and the adult volunteers. You may ask why...

- Class is earlier, so the youth and volunteers can be on their way home to their families by 7:30. Youth have time for homework and to touch base at home. Volunteers and staff with small children are home to tuck them in.
- The meal offers a relaxed an open time for relationship building among the youth, the staff and the volunteers. This time of sharing and listening is valued by all.
- Biblically, table fellowship is vital to the strength of the community!
- When volunteers (not just Confirmation parents) sign up to serve a meal, the stress level on the staff is reduced, so they are not scrambling to prepare a meal in the afternoon. Serving is a gift to the church as well, as we are not buying supplies or ordering pizza.








#### December 8, 2013 Ezekiel 37:1-14

**Key Verses:** "Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord God: 'I am going to open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people; and I will bring you back to the land of Israel. And you shall know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people." Ezekiel 37:12-13



Time: late 500's BCE

**Background:** The book of Ezekiel was written at a time when God's people were in exile. The first chapters are proclamations of judgment for Israel's unfaithfulness to God. Later chapters, like the ones read today, include promises of restoration.

Ezekiel's vision is a dramatic way for God to promise restoration. He tells Ezekiel to prophesy to a valley of dead bones, first renewing them with sinews and flesh, and finally bringing them to life with breath. This was an example of how God intended to bring Israel back to life, despite the despair they experienced at their exile.

**Community:** In what ways is your community dead or dying? What does it need to bring it back to life?

**At Home:** Think of a time when you needed to trust God, and God came through for you. Tell the story to one person this week. Thank God for God's faithfulness.

# CARING CONVERSATIONS

In the Bible readings, we hear the prophets' words of hope and comfort. Ezekiel's vision of God's people as dead, dry bones is no exception. Ezekiel's message is: *God can make even dead, dry bones spring to new life!* In many parts of the Northern Hemisphere, it will be challenging to see the signs of new life God weaves into creation until springtime. However, God gives new life each time we offer comfort and hope to those who are suffering in some way. Complete the following sentence:

## DEVOTIONS

Find a time when everyone in your household can gather, perhaps in the morning or before bedtime. If you are alone, how might you involve other people in your devotions? Shape your time around the following basic pattern:

- Gathering Prayer. Light two candles on your Advent wreath to help you focus on the presence of Christ in your midst. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and discussion starter in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. As you read the passage listed, look for a picture of what Jesus is like.
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

## SERVICE

This time of year, nearly every community has gift collection projects to serve people in need—mitten trees, toy drives, food baskets, and so on. How can you or your household participate in one these projects? Discuss how what you're doing might be like giving a gift of new life.

## **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**

Darken the room. Light two candles on your Advent wreath. Notice how the light radiates into your space. Take a few silent moments to reflect on how God's love radiates around you. As you light an additional candle each week, notice how the light grows as Christmas draws near.

Which holiday decorations in your home are your favorites? What stories are behind them? Do you have any traditions around decorating for the holidays? What new traditions might you start this year?
