John 1:1-18

Key Verse: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." John 1:1

Time: about 30 CE

Background: The gospel of John differs from Matthew, Mark, and Luke in many ways. The three share similar stories. They have similar approaches to interpreting Jesus' presence on the earth. John focuses more on God's word and teachings than on the events of Jesus' life. It looks more at who Jesus was, than on what Jesus did, specifically on Jesus' relationship with God.



This first passage provides a lens through which we can view the rest of the book. It sets up images of light vs. darkness, belief, truth, and testimony. Jesus is the one who points toward God, emphasizing that God is the origin of all things and above all things.

Community: What imagery informs how your community of faith views Jesus? What images are limiting? What images are life-giving? What new images might your community of faith adopt to enhance your view of Jesus? How could these new images inform your community's behavior?

At Home: Think about your life's story. Which is easier to tell: who you are, or what you've done? How do both inform how you choose to live from here on out? What will you keep? What could you change?

SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THE WEEK

The light keeps shining in the dark, and darkness has never put it out. – John 1:5 (CEV)

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

God of light, in the beginning, you spoke a word and there was light. We give thanks and praise that your Word has become flesh in Jesus. Remind us that because of his birth, and also his death and resurrection, there is no darkness that can overcome your Word and your light. We pray in Jesus' name. Amen.

A BLESSING TO SHARE

Use these words to bless another person as you mark his or her forehead with the cross:

May you be as Christ's light shining in the darkness, so that others might know God's love. Amen. (John 1)

DAILY BIBLE READINGS

The story of baby Jesus unfolds in the Bible readings from Luke's Gospel this week. Be creative with these stories. Perhaps each person in your household can play the part of one of the characters or the narrator in a dramatic version of the story. Perhaps one person can move the figures in a nativity set as another reads the story.

The weekly Bible readings are turning from the writings of the prophets to stories of Jesus. If you do not have one, now might be the time get a child-friendly Bible like the *Spark! Picture Bible* (Augsburg Fortress) or *The Jesus Storybook Bible* (Zondervan; available from the Vibrant Faith Ministries online store, www.vibrantfaith.org).

CARING CONVERSATIONS

DEVOTIONS

Even though your schedule may be hectic this week, carve out time for devotion and prayer.

- Gathering Prayer. Light all four candles on your Advent wreath to help you focus on the presence of Christ in your midst. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and the conversation starters in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. How might you bring these readings to life through drama, art, or music?
- Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

SERVICE

This week, most churches will hold more worship services than usual. Ask about ways your household can serve by helping your church prepare for worship or clean up afterward. Plan what you can do to add meaningful service to your holiday worship.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Darken the room. Light all four candles on your Advent wreath. You can pretty much read by this light now, can't you? Sit quietly for a moment and think about the amazing ways you have experienced God's love at work.

Which traditions for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day are your favorites? What stories are behind them? What new traditions might you add this year?
