New Years is always a time of making resolutions. Most of these resolutions center around some form of making yourself stronger—whether that be by eating healthy, exercising, managing finances, working on relationships, etc. All of these things are outstanding. However, I would like to suggest making a resolution that will help bring all of these into focus and meaning. That resolution would be to enhance your life of prayer.

Now, before you skip the rest of this letter because you may feel overwhelmed by that word (prayer) please read on— I promise to be short. This is the program—just start. That's it. There are no formulas. There are no magic words that will make God hear you. There is nothing you have to do before he will start listening to you. To borrow the phrase from Nike—Just Do It. Council Minutes - December 18, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 pm by Council President Brian Boen.

Devotions were led by Cindy.

The minutes of the November meeting were reviewed. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Marie, seconded by Keith, motion carried.

Financial Secretary / Treasurer Report - Gordy

Curt Sather, Treasurer, reviewed the monthly report. We are on track to meet budget.

Eric made a motion to approve the designation of \$1,500.00 of Pastor's salary as a housing/furnishings allowance, seconded by Michelle, motion carried.

The council agreed that Cross of Calvary will transfer banking to F&M and discussed procedures for bank deposits.

A motion to approve the Fin. Sec. / Treasurer Report was made by Gordy, seconded by Natashia, motion carried.

Pastor's Report- Pastor reports that December is going by at a

rapid rate. Normal visits and Bible studies continue. Pastor will be conducting a 10am service Christmas Eve at Fairview Place. He is looking forward to the new year and shared that the staff will be attending Midwinter Convocation at Luther Seminary at the end of January.

Minister of Faith Formation's Report- Jr. High Gathering was a success. Many Cross of Calvary youth were there for the first time and had a positive experience. WeeWOW and choirs start in Jan. The Christmas program went really well. Chelsey will be attending a continuing education event in January.

Committee Reports - No committee meetings were held.

Administration- Dave A, Keith, Michelle, Todd

Dave reported that the soffit and fascia may be scheduled in January and some repair work was done on the north end of the roof in December.

OLD BUSINESS

The Council continued discussion of how funerals are conducted at Cross of Calvary. A motion was made by Michelle to adopt the Cross of Calvary Funeral Policy, seconded by Todd, motion carried. The policy will be published in the January Follower.

Laurie shared the Capital One Rewards information, and will check into the charitable giving option.



Todd shared that three bids are expected for insurance. Renewal is up in February.

NEW BUSINESS

The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on January 19th between services (9:30). The alternate date is January 26.

Committee Reports and Financials are due in the office no later than January 6, 2013.

Changes to Constitution – A motion was made by Gordy to bring the following changes in the Constitution to the Annual Meeting for approval by the congregation, seconded by Dave A., motion carried.

- Allow Council approval for expenditures up to \$5,000 (currently \$2,000). C12.05.c.
- Sixty voting members shall constitute a quorum (currently 40). C10.04.
- The Annual Congregational meeting will be changed from the fourth Wednesday of January to date in January of each year as determined by the council. Two weeks' notice will be given prior to the date and include an alternative date. C10.01.a

The Personnel Committee presented the Cross of Calvary Personnel Committee Policy for Pastoral Sabbatical. Discussion followed. A motion to approve the policy for sabbatical was made by Gordy, seconded by Michelle, motion carried. The

policy will be published in the January Follower.

Facility hours – In order to accommodate the need for members to access the building earlier than 8:30am to deliver food/items for events such as the Ham Dinner, Bazaar, funerals, etc., the building will be opened by 7:15am prior to the event. The number of days will be coordinated between the event leaders and office staff.

The Council was made aware of the Altar Guild's change in their Constitution regarding holding 4 meetings per year. The Council had no objection.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for January 8, 2014, at 8pm. Committees at 7pm.



THE FOLLOWER

Cross of Calvary Funeral Policy

Throughout the generations, one of the wonderful ministries of Cross of Calvary occurs when the church comes together to bury the dead. While the style of funerals and memorial services may change throughout the years, one constant that never changes is the grief and emotions felt by those close to the deceased. Therefore, in our desire to provide the proper attention the family deserves, Cross of Calvary requires the family to work with a licensed funeral director. Funeral directors not only arrange all aspects of a funeral; most importantly, they assist grieving families and are present at the service. If a family has not chosen a funeral director, the church office will provide information, sharing that within 25 miles of Olivia there are six mortuaries that may be contacted to assist with their service.

Why this policy? There are a multitude of preparations that take place at a funeral or memorial service, most of which the family may have no concept of "how they get done." Such items would include, yet are not limited to supply of tables for placement of urn/memorials/photos; providing flower stands/easels/ register book/memorial cards; taking responsibility to clearly communicate the wishes of the family with the clergy and church staff; coordinating reserved pews as well as organizing and guiding the family through the processional & recessional; proper arrangements for and payment to musicians or clergy and to those providing lunch; staging of vehicles for cemetery procession as well as coordination of police escorts, etc. The staff at Cross of Calvary is not equipped to provide such detailed services. So, in order to relieve undue stress and worry for the family, a Christian funeral/memorial service at Cross of Calvary needs the guidance from a licensed funeral director. This, in turn allows the church staff to concentrate on arranging the church service and bulletin, coordinating music, and most importantly, preparing the scripture and message to pay tribute to the deceased.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE POLICY FOR PASTORAL SABBATICAL CROSS OF CALVARY LUTHERAN CHURCH OLIVIA, MINNESOTA

- 1. The pastoral sabbatical process is to be initiated at the discretion of the church council, based on need, to the rostered pastor after a minimum of eight (8) years of service/employment at Cross of Calvary Lutheran Church, Olivia, Minnesota.
- A specific proposal for the sabbatical should be presented to the congregation council four months before the sabbatical is to begin. This proposal should include specific goals and objectives, and detail activities designed to achieve these goals and objectives. A copy of this proposal should be sent to the synodical bishop.
- 3. The length of the sabbatical is determined by the council and will be a minimum of six (6) weeks and a maximum of twelve (12) weeks.
- 4. During the sabbatical, the congregation assumes essential leadership roles or provides for interim leadership while the rostered pastor is away. The congregation's leaders and the pastor should work together prior to the sabbatical to arrange for necessary pastoral coverage during the sabbatical.
- 5. The congregation continues to pay salary and all benefits except mileage during the sabbatical. A sabbatical is not vacation and sabbatical time should not be counted as vacation time.
- 6. The rostered pastor agrees to serve with the congregation for at least one year following completion of the sabbatical.
- 7. When sabbatical begins, the rostered pastor discontinues all leadership roles in the congregation.
- 8. Within 90 days after the completion of the sabbatical, the rostered pastor files a written report on the sabbatical with the bishop and the congregation. This written report should include:
 - a. A restatement of goals and objectives
 - b. A listing of activities undertaken to reach these goals and objectives
 - c. A summary of what was learned and achieved related to the goals and objectives
- 9. It is understood that the sabbatical serves as all the continuing education time for the year in which the sabbatical is taken.
