John 18:12-27

Key Verses: "One of the slaves of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, 'Did I not see you in the garden with him?' Again Peter denied it, and at that moment the cock crowed." John 18:26-27

Time: 33 CE

Background: In John's gospel, Judas came to arrest Jesus at the garden with a detachment of soldiers and police from the chief priests and Pharisees. Jesus came forward willingly, knowing his time had come. Prepared for a fight, Peter and the other disciples drew their swords. Peter even cut off the ear of the slave of one of the high priests before Jesus calmed the crowd.

Jesus was not as silent in John's gospel as in the others. Instead, he spoke plainly, challenging them to find untruth in his words. They could not, of course. But perhaps they were more afraid of the truth of his words than of lies.

Community: What lies are being told that are so subtle that our culture accepts them as truth? How might you uncover some of those lies for yourself? Once discovered, how might you learn to live differently?

At Home: How often do you let peer or cultural pressure shape your behaviors? When was the last time you stood up against pressure to conform or compete? How might you let go of the desire to engage in those comparisons or competitions?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Merciful Jesus, every single day there are opportunities to be faithful to you and opportunities to deny that we have anything to do with you. Sometimes it is just easier not to be involved with you at all. Forgive us. And daily call us to meet you in our caring conversations, our devotions, our serving, and our rituals and traditions. Amen.

A BLESSING TO SHARE

Mark another person's forehead with the sign of the cross as you say this Lenten blessing:

Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return, secure in the promises of Baptism, in the name of the Father, + and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

DAILY BIBLE READINGS

The daily readings invite us to consider Jesus' earthly ministry and glimpse how his words and deeds eventually will lead to his arrest, trial, suffering, and death. Think about where you might be in each story. For example, when Peter denies knowing Jesus, ask yourself, "What would I have done?"

Lent is a season for the 4 Keys for Practicing Faith—Caring Conversations, Devotion: Service, Rituals and Traditions! After you read each passage, pause a moment to think about this question: *How might regular practice of the 4 Keys help me express allegiance to Jesus Christ*?

CARING CONVERSATIONS

John 18:12-27 describes Jesus' suffering during the last days of his earthly life. Most of his disciples have abandoned him. Peter, who hasn't run away, denies that he even knows Jesus. Sit quietly and think about a time when you felt like you were completely alone and abandoned. Tell another person about this time. Discuss: *How close did you feel God was to you during this time? What helped you to endure?*

DEVOTIONS

As the seasons change, your schedule may change as well. You may need to choose a new time for everyone in your household to gather for devotions. If you are alone, how might you connect with other people during your devotional time?

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of Christ in your midst. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas and questions in "Caring Conversations."
- **Daily Bible Reading.** Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What questions do you have about this reading? What do you want to remember from this reading?
- · Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share."

SERVICE

There are many people who feel abandoned and alone. Whom do you know who may be feeling this way right now—a friend in the midst of cancer treatments, a family member in a nursing home, or a neighbor navigating a tough life situation? What might you do or say to offer support and encouragement?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Sometimes household members share time and space, yet rarely speak to each other about things that are important. A ritual and tradition of seeking out time for Caring Conversations is a key practice for defending against experiencing this kind of isolation. What things do you need to take into account to encourage time for such conversation—electronic distractions, work schedules, mealtime rituals, others?
