#### John 20:19-31

**Key Verses:** "Then [Jesus] said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!'" John 20:27-28

#### Time: 30 CE

**Background:** The disciples were afraid. Jesus had been gone only 3 days. They were without their master, and the Jews were clearly ready to do away with Jesus and his followers. They didn't know where to go or what to do. Fear and uncertainty would have been understandable under the circumstances.

Jesus' appearance behind locked doors would have come as a shock. It's not surprising that Thomas would be slow to believe the disciples' account, given the high, intense emotions from the events of the weekend all the disciples had endured.

Despite Thomas' doubt, it should be noted that Thomas did not need to touch Jesus, as he indicated he would. Seeing Jesus was all he needed to know his Lord had returned. His eyewitness account, along with the other disciples' accounts, were that start of the spread of the good news that Jesus was alive!

**Community:** Are there people in your community who may feel as though they've been left out of something good? How might you invite them in?

**At Home:** What areas of faith cause you to doubt? Let yourself sit with that doubt for a while. Ask the hard questions. Consider the scary alternatives. Talk to God. See what happens when you open yourself to your doubts, fears, options, and opportunities.

### SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THE WEEK

#### PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Our Lord and our God, maybe Doubting Thomas gets a bum rap. Maybe he was only being honest when he expressed his questions about life and death. Certainly in the end, he was Believing Thomas. Help me to ask good questions and to trust and believe in the new life you offer. Amen.

### A BLESSING TO SHARE

Mark another person's forehead with the sign of the cross as you say this Easter blessing:

Jesus is the resurrection and the life, and that life has been promised to you. Amen.

### DAILY BIBLE READINGS

Jesus' resurrection has a way of changing people's hearts and minds—their very way of seeing the world around them—and this change is like being raised to new life. This week's readings feature people who have their minds and lives changed. Pause after you read each Bible passage and think about this: *Whose heart and mind and life are being changed*?

If your household includes younger children, you might want to use a child-friendly Bible like the *Spark! Picture Bible* (Augsburg Fortress) or *The Jesus Storybook Bible* (Zondervan; available from the Vibrant Faith Ministries online store, www.vibrantfaith.org).

# CARING CONVERSATIONS

Thomas saw Jesus and believed. Think about times when it was difficult to believe something because you did not see it for yourself. Discuss: What things are hard to believe or understand if you do not experience them for yourself? (For example, hurricanes, blizzards, childbirth, forgiveness.) What helps you understand and trust in situations like these?

## DEVOTIONS

Continue your Easter worship by gathering everyone in your household for devotions. The following basic pattern can be your guide:

- Gathering Prayer. Light a candle to help you focus on the presence of the risen Christ. Pray the "Prayer for the Week."
- Caring Conversations. Take a moment to discuss the ideas in "Caring Conversations."
- Daily Bible Reading. Read aloud the Bible passage suggested for the day. What do you want to remember from this reading?

• Blessing to Share. Bless another person, using "A Blessing to Share." Try having devotions at different times, perhaps first thing in the morning or at noon. In what ways can you connect with other people for devotions if you live alone?

# SERVICE

Many of the passages in John's Gospel refer to *sight*—who can "see" Jesus for who he is and who cannot, and images of light and darkness. In the Scripture Verse for the Week (on front side), Jesus talks to Thomas about seeing and believing. Certain service clubs and mission organizations collect used eyeglasses to be restored and given to people who cannot afford eyeglasses. Think of a way to be part of this serving ministry.

# **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**

One of the oldest Easter traditions is for Christians to exchange this greeting by alternating lines: *Jesus Christ is risen today! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!* Create your own tradition by greeting Christians you know with this greeting during the Easter season.
