God's Story
Your Story

**Devotion:** Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions. You can do this alone, as a couple, as a family; in the morning, during the day, or at night. Find a routine that works best for you.

**Pray:** Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer. God of faith, you promised your people deliverance and evidence of your presence. Grant us the same faith that we might know you are near, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our savior. Amen.

**Reflect:** Reflect on the key verse from Sunday's reading.

O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? Habakkuk 1:2

**Study:** Study the reading and consider the background.

Habakkuk was a prophet who spoke to Jerusalem when it was just about to fall to Babylonian exile. The people had not believed they could be conquered, and yet exile was at their doorstep. Their faith in God wavered, and they questioned where God was.

God responded to Habakkuk's plea, "How long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen?" God's response promised that those who live by faith can endure great suffering. God suggested faith as a way of life. Faith is stronger than despair.

**Read:** Read the following daily readings to deepen your understanding of Sunday's text. After the reading, ask the follow-up questions.

Follow the book of Habakkuk, as the prophet proclaims both judgment and the promise of restoration.

Sunday, Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:2-4; 3:17-19, Faith as a Way of Life

Monday, Habakkuk 1:5-11, The Prophet's Complaint

Tuesday, Habakkuk 1:12—2:1, The Prophet's Complaint

Wednesday, Habakkuk 2:5-14, The Woes of the Wicked

Thursday, Habakkuk 2:15-20, The Woes of the Wicked

Friday, Habakkuk 3:1-7, The Woes of the Wicked

Saturday, Habakkuk 3:8-16, The Woes of the Wicked

What was God doing here? How were the people's actions punished or rewarded?

**Connect:** Connect in conversation with others in your household. Discuss the following questions, or simply check in with "Highs" and "Lows."

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- In what ways is your community in exile? Where do you feel your community is isolated from God? Where do you feel it is close to God?
- When has your faith in God been tested? In what ways have your beliefs changed as you learn and grow?

**Do:** By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Hold a prayer vigil for your community and those communities around you.

**Bless:** Close your devotion with a blessing.

God our strength, we rejoice in you as we hear your word. Speak faith and patience to us today. Amen.

# Sharing GOD'S STORY @ home

<u>SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THE WEEK</u>— The righteous live by their faith.—Habakkuk 2:4b

**PRAYER FOR THE WEEK**—To be used in a variety of ways over the course of the week—first thing in the morning; before you go to bed; as an opening or closing to household devotion time (see reverse); etc.

O, Lord—Like Habakkuk, we might look around at the violence and injustice in our world and ask, "Will you not save?" You promised him that there would come a day when all things would be made right. In this season of waiting, strengthen our faith in you and in your promises given to us in Jesus. Amen.

A BLESSING TO SHARE—A blessing can be a powerful ritual that reminds us of God's promises and presence, both through the words, as well as the touch that we share. This can be used as a "good-bye." It could be used as a bed-time blessing. Be creative in the way you bless and are blessed by the people in your life.

As you mark one another with the sign of the cross on the forehead, say,

"Rejoice in the Lord. Exult in the God of your salvation. Amen."

DAILY BIBLE READINGS—The prophet Habakkuk probably wrote right before the destruction of Jerusalem in 587 BC. We know little else about the prophet other than his name. Habakkuk wrote his book as a dialog or conversation between him and God, which other prophets and writers in the Bible also used. (See Job 38-42, for example.) This week's readings will repeat some of Sunday's sections, but this time, your household is encouraged to read it like a dialog. Have someone read Habakkuk's part; then have someone read God's part. Additionally, you will continue to hear those prophetic themes that are lifted up throughout the Old Testament prophets—concerns about who/what is being worshiped; justice issues related to the economy, treatment of the poor, etc.; and (less so in Habakkuk) a vision of a wide welcome for people beyond God's chosen people. Listen for these as you read. Finally, the week's readings wrap up by going back and picking up some of the history of Jerusalem's fall.

If you are using a kid-friendly Bible in your household, you will very likely NOT find these readings there. Read to your kids anyway. Just pick a story! CARING CONVERSATIONS—Each week, a topic for discussion is introduced that is connected to the weekly theme introduced by Sunday's Bible reading. This topic can be used at any time during the week. But it is not by any means the only Caring Conversation you can have—try checking in with "Highs & Lows" (What was the best/worst part of your day?) or "God moments" (Where do you think you saw God's love active and present today?). The main point is to be on the look-out for opportunities to move your house-hold's talk from the surface toward intimacy.

- The book of Habakkuk is written as if it was a conversation between God and Habakkuk. Habakkuk asks hard questions of God like, "Why don't you fix what's wrong in our country?" If you were to ask hard questions of God, what would you ask? Look at Psalm 6, 10, and 13 for ways that other people of faith questioned God.
- Advent is a season of waiting—waiting for the celebration of Christmas; waiting for school to be out; waiting to open presents; and more. In Habakkuk 2:2-4, God tells Habakkuk to wait. What is hard about waiting? Is there anything good about waiting? What helps to pass the time while you wait?
- In the end, Habakkuk says that he will rejoice, sing, and trust in God, even if bad things happen (3:17-19). What is your favorite Advent or Christmas carol, and why?

<u>DEVOTIONS</u>—One way of thinking about devotions is as a continuation of our community's worship, or at least as a connection with it. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions:

- Gathering Prayer—If your household uses an Advent wreath, this might be the point
  to light it, followed by the PRAYER FOR THE WEEK from the front or the one suggested below under RITUALS & TRADITIONS.
- Caring Conversation—As suggested above, this could be as simple as a daily check in
  with each other or an extended conversation using the topic(s) suggested above.
- Daily Bible Reading—Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front.
   What do you want to remember from this reading? Households with small children might simply review the basics of the story read from an age-appropriate Bible.
- Closing Ritual—Some way of signaling the end: A BLESSING TO SHARE from the
  front; the Lord's Prayer; or a song, either sung or recorded, especially a song of the
  season during Advent. If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the
  devotion time.


Note: This is only a suggested pattern. It will vary with YOUR household's context and patterns. What works best for you? First thing in the morning? Over breakfast? Bed time? Even if you don't have children in your household, or if you live alone, be creative and flexible with how you practice and keep your devotions.

**SERVICE** — SERVICE is how we enact God's great love for the entire world.

Many households will be decorating for the season at this point. How can you be helpful around the house?

<u>RITUALS & TRADITIONS</u>—Here is a prayer for lighting the Advent wreath that echoes the Advent carol, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O Emmanuel, God With Us, Jesus Christ—You are the desire of every nation, Savior of all peoples. Come and dwell among us. Amen.
