No changes or additions were made. *A motion was made by Chet Boen to adopt the agenda for the congregational meeting, seconded by Gordy Blem, motion carried.* 

Brian announced the appointed tellers as Eric Skeie, Greg Mertens and Ron Nelson. *A motion was made by Jill Hanson to approve the tellers, seconded by DeeAnne Newville, motion carried.* 

Laurie Schultze was appointed as recorder to take minutes for the meeting. *A motion was made by Lynn Tesch to approve the secretary, seconded by Cindy Johnson, motion carried.* 

A quorum was declared with over 60 voting members present.

Devotions were led by Pasto Matt, as read from the inside cover of the report.

The ushers distributed the ballots. Brian reviewed the ballot and opened the floor for any additional nominations. No changes were made to the ballot.

A motion to approve the ballot was made by Dana Boen, seconded by Becky Nelson, motion carried.

Pastor Matt Hausken thanked the Congregation for their support and prayers last year at this time. He missed the Annual Meeting due to the passing of his father. Pastor then thanked the outgoing council members – Brian Boen, Sandy Whited and Dave Altmann. He also thanked the staff and volunteers for serving the church throughout the year.

Pastor noted that there were 19 baptisms in 2014, and there were many new members added. We have grown to 1044 members; what a blessing. Pastor pointed out that with growth comes many opportunities to serve.

This year's Lenten journey will follow Rick Warren's "The Daniel Plan." The book can be purchased at most locations that sell books. It is also available in electronic format. The Faith 5 Steering Committee is working on some wonderful plans.

Brian asked if there were any changes to the record of Pastoral Acts and the reports from the Synod and Gustavus. all as printed in the Annual Report. Having none, *Angie Boen made a motion to accept the reports, seconded by Sandy Gay, motion carried.* 

Brian asked the congregation to review the standing committee reports as written in the annual report. Having done so, *Sandy Whited made a motion to accept the*  standing committee reports, seconded by Cheryl Mallak, motion carried.

Brian asked the congregation to review the financial reports as presented in the annual report. Having done so, *a motion to accept the financial reports were made by George Tesch, seconded by Todd Gay, motion carried.* 

Curt Sather, treasurer, presented the proposed budget for 2015, which had been forwarded from the council. He began by sharing the Council's thanks to the congregation, as we are in good financial standing.

Curt stated that this year's budget is a little more than last year's, and walked the congregation through the layout. He also explained the reasoning for the increase in Pastor's benefit package and made note of the extra \$2400 to use for the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration.

Detroit, the host city for the 2015 ELCA Youth Gathering, is a diverse, distinct city with a rich history. The birthplace of the car industry and Motown music, Detroit also played a critical role in the underground railroad and in the industrialization of America. Although the media would have you believe Detroit is on the verge of collapse — its residents know a different story.

The city they know, our host city, has faced and continues to face its share of challenges. Yet there is a growing revitalization effort underway, and we believe God is calling us to Detroit for the 2015 ELCA Youth Gathering to learn from and serve among our brothers and sisters there.

Downtown Detroit, where the two main venues for the Gathering are located, is a hub of vibrancy and activity. With new companies headquartered downtown and more than 11,000 new employees working and living in the city, Detroit is home to many young adults at the beginning of their professional careers. With great architecture, cultural opportunities and winning sports teams, Detroit has much to offer visitors.

The Detroit metro area is also the home to several faithful ELCA congregations who are living out their faith in new and exciting ways. Take Grace in Action, for instance. Grace in Action is an ELCA faith community dedicated to reclaiming the mission of the church, being transformed by God and each other and building a more just society for all of God's people. The ministries at Grace in Action are inspired by the visions and dreams of people in the community: open mic night, citizenship class, prayer group and more. That is just one story from Detroit.

Detroit has much to teach us about being a part of what God is up to at this time in our history. The story youth and their adult leaders will hear there, and will proclaim there, is that Jesus endured death for us, and Jesus rose from the grave in fulfillment of God's plan, to make us worthy in Christ, to write us into a new story in which we are free from our fears of the powers of sin, death and the devil.

There are many people in Detroit who know experiences of death, and there are many Lutherans, and brothers and sisters from partner communions who stand alongside the citizens of Detroit with the cross, proclaiming healing and wholeness in the midst of the death and despair. God is calling us to bear witness to their story, and to his creative and redeeming story of death and resurrection.

We will gather in Detroit in July 2015 to be inspired, encouraged, strengthened, connected and sent out to do God's work in the world.
