



Summer Camps Make Kids Resilient

February 5, 2012 by Michael Ungar, Ph.D. in Nurturing Resilience

- 1. New relationships, not only with peers, but with trusted adults other than their parents.
- 2. A powerful **identity** that makes the child feel confident.
- 3. Camps help children feel in control of their lives. Children who experience themselves as competent will be problem-solvers.
- 4. Camp gives them opportunities to just be kids who are valued for who
- 5. At camp kids get what they need to develop physically. Ideally, fresh air, exercise, a balance between routine and unstructured time, and all the good food their bodies need
- 6. Best of all, camps offer kids a chance to feel like they belong.
