Come rain or shine, or even snow, the East Boston Community Soup Kitchen opens each Tuesday without fail, serving up nutritious fare — with an extra helping of love — from the basement of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church.

"Nothing stops us," said lead volunteer Sandra Aleman-Nijjar. "I think only health will stop us, but God has been good. So as long as I have health and my team, then we're here."

Sandra and her team of volunteers offer weekly breakfast, lunch and dinner to more than a hundred guests, many of whom face the challenges of poverty and addiction. Guests can pick up hygiene kits or a set of clean clothes and can access social services. What makes this program special, however, is its attention to matters of the heart.

"This space is where we all come together and treat each other with love, with that respect and dignity that we all like to receive," Sandra said. "We give that to everyone that walks through those doors."

Eddie has been coming through the doors of Our Saviour's since the soup kitchen started in September 2016. The

program, which receives funding from ELCA World Hunger, has been a game changer. From age 18, Eddie has lived on the street. "I had nowhere to go and [now] this is my home," he said.

At the soup kitchen, Eddie feels respected as a whole person. And though he's grateful for the food and resources he receives, he's most appreciative of the people, connecting with fellow guests during circle time and valuing the support Sandra has given him. Since Eddie started coming to the soup kitchen, she and others have noticed a change in him.

"He feels loved, that someone cares," she said of Eddie. "You can see it in [each of] them, that sense of belonging, that sense of acceptance. That someone cares about them, that someone is watching and looking out for their well-being."

SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined. Isaiah 9:2 (NRSV)

PRAYERS AND BLESSING

A Prayer for the Week:

Almighty God, you who reject sin and death, bring light and life to your world through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

May this gift of food remind us of your light that shines in the world. We pray for all those in need of food today. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May the light of Christ shine on you and be your strength and salvation. (Psalm 27:1)

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:
What does the word "hope" mean to you? What gives you hope?
In the Bible "light" refers to the presence of God bringing life and hope. Where have you seen the light of God in the world?
Good leaders find hope and direction in difficult situations. How does Jesus lead with hope that

gives his followers clear direction?

DEVOTIONS

Read: Matthew 4:12-23.

The Epiphany season continues with a focus on the reign of God fulfilled in Jesus. His reign challenges every power and authority on earth. Jesus begins his public ministry when hearing of the arrest of John the Baptist by the governing powers. He moves from Nazareth to Capernaum which is located in Zebulun and Naphtali, land dominated by foreign powers from the time of the Assyrians down to the Greeks and then the Romans. "[T]he people who sat in darkness have seen a great light" (v. 16). Jesus' reign brings life, not death, light, not darkness. In Jesus the work and will of God shines brightly. He gathers disciples and leads people into God's reign of life and hope: "Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people" (v. 23). Where do you experience the light of Christ in your life today?

Pray: The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? In the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, amen.

SERVICE

Jesus began his ministry in Galilee. He began calling disciples to help him "proclaim the good news of the kingdom and cure every disease and sickness among the people" (Matthew 4:23b). Jesus still needs help today to do the same. As a follower of Jesus, in what ways do you proclaim the good news to others and help cure diseases and sickness?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Draw a candle to symbolize the light of Christ in the center of a sheet of paper and write "Christ" inside the candle. Write names of people you know who are of other races, backgrounds or cultures around the candle. Read the names. What makes each one different from you? What makes them the same? Read 1 Corinthians1:10. Paul describes divisions between the people and wants them to be united in the same mind and the same purpose (v.10). What does this mean for Christians today?
